


## **UNIVERSITY OF TASMANIA / CENTENARY BUILDING LOCATION (Building #10)**


Harvard Lecture Theatres 1 and 2. Ground level - behind glass facade Centenary Lecture Theatre

Ground level - enter through glass sliding doors






